### **Bishop Scott Jones General Superintendent of the GMC**

**Scott Jameson Jones** (born 23 May 1954) is an American bishop of the Global Methodist Church and former bishop of the United Methodist Church, elected in 2004, serving until his retirement and subsequent resignation from the episcopal office and transfer to the GMC in 2023. He was born in Nashville, TN and raised in Illinois, IN, and Colorado.

He met his wife, Mary Lou Reece, while a student at the University of Kansas, and they were married 18 August 1979. She is the president of Reece Construction Company, with offices in Salina, Kansas and Prosper, Texas. The couple has three children and five grandchildren.

Jones earned a B.A. degree in philosophy at the University of Kansas (1977 with highest honors). He is a member of Phi Beta Kappa. He earned an M.Th. degree at Perkins School of Theology, Southern Methodist University (1981 with high honors). Jones's Ph.D. is also from Southern Methodist University, which he earned in 1992 in religious studies.

#### Episcopal ministry

---

Jones was endorsed for election to the Episcopacy by the North Texas Conference Delegation to the South-Central Jurisdictional Conference and was elected in July 2004. He was assigned to the Kansas Episcopal Area, with offices in Wichita, Kansas. He was initially very popular, particularly with younger members of the Kansas East and Kansas West Annual Conferences.

Jones took over the new Great Plains Conference, which was formed in 2014 by combining the former Kansas East, Kansas West, and Nebraska United Methodist Conferences.

In 2016 he was assigned to the Texas Annual Conference (Houston Area) where he served until January 2023.

In January of 2023 Scott Jones resigned as a Bishop of the UMC and withdrew his conference membership to unite with The Global Methodist Church.

### **President Pro-Tem Rev. Dr. Mike Powers**

The MidSouth Transitional Conference Advisory Team (TCAT) of the Global Methodist Church is excited to announce the selection of Rev. Dr. Mike Powers as President Pro-Tem. When asked about his reaction to being named President Pro-Tem Mike replied, “I am honored by the support of the Transitional Leadership Council and our friends across the MidSouth region as I serve in this important role. God is honoring the GMC across our streets and around the world in our devotion to be and make faithful and fruitful disciples of Jesus.”

The warm-hearted, evangelical spirit of the local Methodists and the open-minded, ecumenicity of the Disciples of Christ in his hometown of Stanford, Kentucky proved to be a good introduction to the call for Mike to follow Christ in ministry across the streets of Kentucky and around the world. Following graduation from Asbury college in 1974 and Asbury Theological Seminary 1981, he served as pastor of six congregations and later served as superintendent of the Bowling Green District (UMC). In 1997, Mike completed a Doctor of Ministry degree from Asbury Seminary. Since then, he has served in missions and led mission efforts in several countries. He also served as a delegate to three General Conferences (UMC).

Mike has enjoyed serving as Adjunct Faculty at Lindsey Wilson College and Asbury Theological Seminary and authored *Prayers for the Journey*. Upon retirement in 2017, he continued in part-time ministry with the Francis Asbury Society as well as Discipleship and Congregational Care ministries in the Lexington, Kentucky area.

Mike joined the Global Methodist Church in November 2022 and soon after was appointed as organizer for the GMC in Kentucky. Since that time, he has been leading the teams that came together from Kentucky, West Virginia, Southwestern Virginia, and Tennessee to organize the MidSouth Annual Conference. Mike’s Christ-centered leadership is inspiring to all who collaborate with him.

Mike shares his life in Christ and ministry with his wife Sherry. Sherry is the Provost and Chief Academic Officer at Asbury University in Wilmore, Kentucky. They have one son, Jonathan, who lives in Wilmore with his wife, Faith, and their two daughters, Audrey and Elizabeth. Jonathan serves as the Assistant Professor of Worship Studies at Asbury Theological Seminary. Mike and Sherry’s daughter, Leah, lives in Gainesville, Florida where she is a doctoral student in international education and social foundations at the University of Florida.



**Conference Lay Leader: David R. Duggan**

David R. Duggan, Blount County circuit judge, is the author of the book, *Alcoa: A Century in Words and Pictures*. He also co-authored *Alcoa* and *Maryville* in Arcadia Publishing's *Images of America* series. He is Alcoa city historian, a former Blount County Library board chair, member of Alcoa Kiwanis, and chair of the church council, a Sunday School teacher, and church historian at Alcoa First Methodist Church. As chair of the Next Step Committee, he led Alcoa First Methodist's disaffiliation from the United Methodist Church. He chaired the City of Alcoa's 75<sup>th</sup> Anniversary and Centennial Committees. Named to the *Daily Times* Alumni Wall of Fame in 2010, he received the Blount Historic Trust Champion Award in 2015. He also received, in 2018, a Community History Award, and in 2022 an Award of Distinction, from the East Tennessee Historical Society. He is president and a director of the Faith and Family Coalition, Inc. He serves as president of the Knoxville chapter of the Federalist Society. Alcoa High School's lyceum is named in his honor. Duggan also serves on the Mr. P Foundation board.

## Church Planting Pre-Conference Report

The MidSouth Church Planting Team is currently made up of Aaron Mansfield, Eliseo Mejia, Mark Wilson, and Brian Ebel. Church Planting in the GMC is coordinated by The River Network. The River Network has responsibility for the church planting strategies and tactics for the GMC.

Any regional-level church body, be that of an Annual Conference or the larger international GMC, needs to annually plant new churches at a rate that is 3% of its total number of churches. The GMC Strategic Plan calls for planting 3,500 churches in the next 7 years. That is a tall order, but one that, with the powerful help of the Holy Spirit, we can accomplish! The MidSouth as of the writing of this report has 211 churches. That means we need to plant 6 churches to maintain our numbers, and if we plant more than that, we are likely to grow.

I am very pleased to share with you the new churches that have emerged in the MidSouth region so far.

Smoky Mountain Methodist Church, Maryville, TN

Asbury Methodist Church, Franklin, TN

Trinity Methodist Church, Princeton, KY

Trinity Methodist Church, Williamstown, KY

Trinity Methodist Church, Frankfort, KY

We have some other churches in the exploration phase:

A house church network in Northern Kentucky

A new church plant in Richmond, KY

A new church in Tennessee, made up of folks whose church did not vote to disaffiliate.

Pine Brook Jesus People in Lexington, KY has started monthly evangelistic ministry.

Lay people in Central City, KY, Paducah, KY, and Somerset, KY are also in prayer and discernment about starting new churches.

Jay Ferguson is busy gathering rural churches near Bluefield, VA in a movement of prayer and stoking up the flame of fellowship and discipleship. This is an exciting ministry opportunity that is about building a network of like-minded people and churches to reach a region for Christ.

So, we already have 5 churches planted, at least 5 other projects in some form of commencement, and 3 communities discerning their path. We are well on our way, heading past the 3% mark of maintaining an Annual Conference, and into growing it, not just with disaffiliated churches coming in, but by planting new churches.

The goal of the Church Planting team is to pour gasoline on the fires the Holy Spirit starts in hearts and communities. There is no credit due to us as a team; we seek to be decentralized, permission-giving, and disciple-making. If a person or teams says they want to plant a church, we say, “Yes!” and then we connect them with training and ongoing encouragement.

Ten people from the MidSouth Region have attended The River Network’s Planting Healthy Churches training. At least 4 more will attend October’s training. Completion of the training grants attendees the approval to plant churches in the GMC.

Seventeen people attended The River Network’s online training, “Planting a Church Without a Pastor.” Mark your calendars—church planters and their teams will have a GMC-only breakout session at The Exponential Conference in Orlando, March 4-7, 2024 [<https://exponential.org/>]. This is the premier church planting event in the world, and the GMC is starting off as a player on that scene!

Four people will be a part of a Learning Community offered by Exponential, “The Multiplication Operating System.” They will learn from the best practitioners of church multiplication from around the country through the course of year, reading and learning on site from strong churches.

Most of the church planting that has come about in the MidSouth region has come from people whose churches did not disaffiliate. While this has provided some immediate church planting growth, it will probably not be the long-term path for church planting; at some point, people whose churches did not disaffiliate will either have planted a church or moved to another worshipping community.

To move forward with ambitious goals to plant 3500 churches throughout the denomination in the next 7 years, and to be looking to plant more than 3% of the number of churches in the MidSouth, we need a solid plan. As I mentioned before, we seek to be decentralized, permission-giving, and disciple-making.

Decentralized, because churches plant churches, not annual conference committees.

Permission-giving, because if you want to plant a church, we want to help you! People on the streets know their communities best.

Disciple-making, because if you simply start a new church, you might get disciples; but if you make disciples, you will always get a church, because disciples must worship!

More specifically, we will be creating networks of pastors who gather for fellowship, learning, encouragement, and sharing resources to plant new churches. We call these networks “Friends on Mission.” Where one church may not have the resources to plant by itself, a Friends on Mission network of 5, 6, or 7 churches will have the resources. They can recruit planters and send potential members of the new church. Existing churches can provide administrative support and mentoring for new churches. The pastors can serve as sounding boards and encouragers for the planter team. The pastors and their churches can be a strong part of the funding stream of a new church.

If you would like to be part of a Friends on Mission network, please let me know. We have a lot of work to do to plant churches! I tell people that church planting is hard, but knowable; it is not rocket science. If you feel you want to be involved but don’t feel like a planter yourself, great! We will put you together with like-minded pastors, and the energy around disciple-making and evangelism will spill back into your local ministry!

## MidSouth Provisional Annual Conference of the Global Methodist Church

Conference Finance and Administration Committee

Greetings in the great name of Jesus, the Christ! We are the members of the Finance and Administration Committee. We want to introduce you to the process used to remit the Connectional Funding (formerly UMC apportionments) to the Annual and General Conferences. There are several differences from the former methods and formulas used by your UMC Annual Conferences. Briefly, they are:

- 1.) The months Connectional Funding will be needed in 2023.
- 2.) The process for obtaining a Connectional Funding waiver or exemption.
- 3.) Seed gifts for the MidSouth Provisional Annual Conference.
- 4.) Where Connectional Funding checks will be sent.
- 5.) The formula to be used.
- 6.) The forms to be sent to the Conference and future abilities to access Connectional Funding history.
- 7.) The transfer of ministry.

And now, the details:

### **The months Connectional Funding will be needed in 2023.**

We have had several questions regarding what months Connectional Funding will be needed in 2023, as most of our churches disaffiliated this year. The answer is two-fold:

- a. The Global Methodist Church General Conference Connectional Funding.  
According to *The Book of Doctrines and Discipline*, ¶355.3, Connectional Funding payments for the General Church should start beginning with the *effective date of affiliation with the Global Methodist Church*.
- b. The MidSouth Provisional Annual Conference Connectional Funding.  
Since the Provisional Annual Conference will officially be organized in September at the convening conference, the budget for Connectional Funding was based on funding payments of October through December. Therefore, we are asking for the churches to *start Connectional Funding in October of 2023*.

### **The process for obtaining a Connectional Funding waiver or exemption.**

We are aware the disaffiliation process has been costly for all churches in the MidSouth Conference. With this, the Transitional Leadership Council have included ¶349.7:

The Transitional Leadership Council or its designee may designate a local church as a missional church and exempt such a church from paying general church or annual conference connectional funding for up to five years from the date of designation. Missional churches shall be church



plants, church re-starts, or churches located in or serving economically disadvantaged communities. (*The Book of Doctrines and Discipline* ¶349.7)

**Seed gifts for the MidSouth Provisional Annual Conference.**

We are aware many churches have been either paying or saving funds to pay Connectional Funding before MidSouth was organized. With this, we are asking both churches and individuals to consider a seed gift to the MidSouth PAC for start-up expenses. There have been large outlays for the formation of the Conference with a few churches providing funding. A separate mailing will come out detailing the usage of the Seed Gifts.

MidSouth PAC monthly statements will detail not just the Connectional Funding remittances, but any other remittances to the conference office as well. Soon, churches will be able to access their historical giving through a mobile app. More will be published later.

**The transfer of ministry.**

Lastly, the GMC *Book of Doctrines and Discipline* states, "The local church is a strategic base from which Christians move out to the structures of society, providing the most significant arena through which disciple-making occurs." (¶308)

The GMC General and MidSouth Provisional Annual Conferences, from their inception, have been designed to be lean organizations. The intent is to transfer the primary area of ministry from larger organizations to the local church. As a result, the funds required to support structures beyond the local church are greatly reduced when compared to the past. This leaves more funds with local churches with the ability to invest the difference into the ministries you are called to support. The MidSouth Provisional Annual Conference challenges each local church to live into ¶308. Use the difference in funding the structures of the organizations beyond the local church to be the most significant arena through which disciple-making occurs.

## **Housing Resolution**

### **RESOLUTION RELATING TO RENTAL/HOUSING ALLOWANCES FOR RETIRED OR DISABLED MINISTERS**

The MidSouth Annual Conference (the “Conference”) hereby adopts the following resolution relating to rental/housing allowances for retired (senior status) or disabled clergypersons of the Conference:

**WHEREAS**, the religious denomination known as The Global Methodist Church (the “Church”), of which this Conference is a part, functions through ministers of the gospel (within the meaning of the Internal Revenue Code section 107) who were or are duly ordained, commissioned, or licensed ministers of the Church (“Clergypersons”).

**WHEREAS**, the practice of the Church and this Conference was and is to provide active Clergypersons with a parsonage or a rental/housing allowance as part of their gross compensation

**WHEREAS**, pensions or other amounts paid to retired (senior status) and disabled Clergypersons are considered to be deferred compensation and are paid to retired (senior status) and disabled Clergypersons in consideration of previous active service; and **WHEREAS**, the Internal Revenue Service has recognized the Conference as the appropriate organization to designate a rental/housing allowance for Clergypersons who are or were members of this Conference,

#### **THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:**

**THAT** an amount equal to 100% of the pension or disability payments received from plans authorized under The Transitional Book of Doctrine and Discipline of The Global Methodist Church (the “TBDD”), which includes all such payments from Wespath, during the years 2023 and 2024 by each retired (senior status) or disabled Clergyperson who is or was a member of the Conference, be and hereby is designated as a rental/housing allowance for each such Clergyperson; and

**THAT** the pension or disability payments to which this rental/housing allowance applies will be any pension or disability payments from plans, annuities, or funds authorized under the TBDD, including such payments from Wespath and a commercial annuity company that provides an annuity arising from benefits accrued under a Wespath plan, annuity, or fund authorized under the TBDD, that results from any service a Clergyperson rendered to this Conference or that an active, retired (senior status) or



disabled Clergy person of this Conference rendered to any local church, the annual conference of the Church, a general agency of the Church, other institution of the Church, the former denomination that is now a part of the Church, or any other employer that employed the Clergy person to perform services related to the ministry of the Church, or its predecessors, and that elected to make contributions to, or accrue a benefit under, such a plan, annuity, or fund for such retired (senior status) or disabled Clergy person's pension or disability as part of his or her gross compensation.

NOTE: The rental/housing allowance that may be excluded from a Clergy person's gross income in any year for federal income tax purposes is limited under Internal Revenue Code section 107(2) and regulations thereunder to the least of:

- (1) The amount of the rental/housing allowance designated by the Clergy person's employer or other appropriate body of the Church (such as this Conference in the foregoing resolutions) for such year.
- (2) The amount expended by the Clergy person to rent or provide a home in such year; or
- (3) The home's fair rental value, including furnishings and appurtenances (such as a garage), plus the cost of utilities in such a year.

The housing/rental allowance exclusion is available only to clergy, not to surviving spouses. Still, the death of a minister during the year does not invalidate the exclusion for the entire year. The exclusion is still available for the part of the year the minister was alive.

Neither Wespeth nor the MidSouth Annual Conference gives legal tax advice, and each minister should consult with their attorney, CPA, or other tax advisors.

**ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION  
OF THE MIDSOUTH PROVISIONAL  
ANNUAL CONFERENCE OF THE GLOBAL  
METHODIST CHURCH, INC.**

**KNOW ALL PERSONS BY THESE PRESENTS**, That the undersigned, desiring to form a nonprofit corporation under the provisions of §§273.100, et seq. of the Kentucky Revised Code (“KRS”), and section 501 (c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, as amended, (the “Code”), and *The Global Methodist Church Transitional Book of Doctrines and Discipline (hereinafter Discipline)* as may be hereafter modified, do hereby adopt the following Articles of Incorporation:

**ARTICLE I: NAME OF CORPORATION**

The name of the corporation hereby formed is The MidSouth Provisional Annual Conference of the Global Methodist Church, Inc., and as such shall constitute a body corporate, with perpetual succession, and shall have power to sue and be sued, to contract and be contracted with, to adopt a corporate seal, and to conduct and operate its business and affairs.

**ARTICLE II: ADDRESS**

A. The principal office of said corporation is located at 1580 Lexington Road, Wilmore, Kentucky 40390.

B. The name of the registered agent is Mike Powers and the street address of the corporation’s initial registered office in Kentucky is 1580 Lexington Road, Wilmore, Kentucky 40390.

**ARTICLE III: INCORPORATORS**

The names and addresses of the Incorporators are:

#### **ARTICLE IV: PURPOSES**

The objects and purposes of the corporation, and the powers it shall have and may exercise, are as more fully set forth in KRS 273.171 and the *Discipline* (as may hereafter, from time to time be amended,) including the following:

- (a) The promotion of the Wesleyan expression of Christianity through worship, preaching, teaching, baptizing and the administration of other sacraments, rooted and grounded in the Scriptures, and in the historic teachings of the Christian faith as defined in the *Global Methodist Church's Articles of Religion and Confession of Faith*, all in order to make Disciples of Jesus Christ who worship passionately, love extravagantly and witness boldly.
- (b) Conducting the work of the corporation not for profit, but exclusively for charitable, scientific, literary, religious or educational purposes within the meaning of Section 501 (c) (3) of the Code in such manner (i) that no part of its income or property shall inure to the private benefit of any donor, director or individual having a personal or private interest in the activities of the Corporation, except as reasonable compensation for services actually rendered, (ii) that it shall not directly or indirectly participate in or intervene in any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office, and (iii) that no substantial part of its activities shall be carrying on propaganda or otherwise attempting to influence legislation; and that it may make, if desired, distributions to organizations which qualify as tax exempt organizations as defined by Section 501 (c)(3) of the Code in addition to the charitable donations of its intended ministry.
- (c) Acquiring, owning and maintaining real estate, buildings, gifts, bequests and funds, and all other property, real or personal.

- (e) To engage in other activities, projects and business permitted for a non-stock, non-profit corporation.

#### **ARTICLE V: DISSOLUTION**

In the event of a dissolution of the corporation, the Directors of the Corporation shall, after making provisions for the payment of the liabilities of the corporation, dispose of all of the assets of the corporation in a manner consistent with the provisions of the Kentucky Revised Statutes and the *Discipline*.

Any assets not disposed of in accordance with the above direction shall be disposed of by a court of competent jurisdiction in which the principal office of the corporation is then located for all such purposes as shall at the time qualify as an exempt organization under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended.

#### **ARTICLE VI: MEMBERS**

The members of the corporation shall be those persons as determined and specified by the by-laws of the Conference and the *Discipline*, as may be hereafter modified.

#### **ARTICLE VII: DIRECTORS**

1. **Board of Directors.** The business and affairs of the Corporation shall be under the supervision, management and control of a Board of Directors, which shall exercise the Corporation's power and authority as provided by its By-laws. The Board of Directors shall consist of 8 members, all of whom shall be elected in the manner and the exact number of which shall be that fixed from time to time by the Corporation's By-laws. The terms of the Directors of the Corporation shall be as provided by its By-laws. The Directors shall be elected and vacancies shall be filled as provided in the By-laws.

2. **Vacancies.** Vacancies on the Board of Directors shall be filled as provided by the Bylaws.

3. **Limitation of Liability.** Neither the Directors or officers of this Corporation, nor its agents, employees and those acting at its request, nor any subsidiary, affiliated or supporting organization, nor its or their successors, shall be liable for the debts, liabilities or

obligations of this Corporation, and the private property of such persons, organizations and agencies shall not be subject to the payment of corporate debts. The provisions of KRS 411.200, KRS 273.248 and KRS 273.171(14), and any future amendments thereto and any successor enactments, are adopted to the fullest extent permitted.

The Board of Directors shall be authorized to obtain, maintain in effect, and pay for insurance to provide coverage for defense fees plus indemnification for the actions of the officers, Directors, committee members, agents, and employees of the Corporation against whom claims have been made for losses, damages and judgments arising out of actions taken by said persons while acting with their scope of authority as an officer, Director, committee member, agent or employee of the Corporation.

#### **ARTICLE VIII: BYLAWS**

The Bylaws of this corporation and said *Discipline* shall govern all action taken by the Board of Directors of this corporation. A board of directors shall manage the corporation, and the number of directors constituting the initial board of directors shall be eight (8). The number of directors thereafter shall be as the By-laws of the corporation and *Discipline* may, from time to time, provide. The Directors shall meet the qualifications of the *Discipline* and shall be elected for a term of four years. Nothing herein, or in the *Discipline* shall be construed to prevent the election of a director to self-succession. All directors shall have equal voting power. The Directors shall be elected to serve in four (4) annual classes consisting of two (2) persons in each annual class. Any required contract, deed, bill of sale, mortgage, or other written instrument necessary to carry out action authorized by the Board of Directors of the corporation shall be executed in the name of the corporation and signed by any two of its officers; and, any instrument so executed shall be binding and effective as the action of the corporation.

**ARTICLE X**

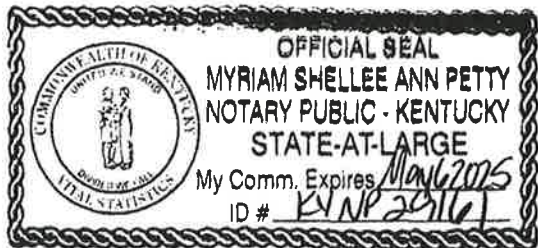

# The MidSouth Provisional Annual Conference Of the Global Methodist Church Bylaws

## Article I

**Section 1. Introduction.** These Bylaws constitute the regulations adopted by The MidSouth Provisional Annual Conference of the Global Methodist Church, Inc. (hereinafter referred to as “the annual conference” and “the GM church”, respectively.)

### Section 2. Powers.

- A. The Annual Conference shall have the purposes and powers as may be stated in its Articles of Incorporation.
- B. The Annual Conference is subject to the provisions and governance of the GM Church’s *Transitional Book of Doctrines and Discipline* (the “*TBD&D*”), as amended from time to time, and any subsequent *Book of Doctrines and Discipline* (the “*BD&D*”) adopted by the GM Church’s General Conference. The *TBD&D* and *BD&D* shall take precedence over these bylaws in the event of a conflict or the silence of these bylaws on any topic.

**Section 3. Purposes.** The Annual Conference is an association of congregations, clergy persons, and laity within the GM Church denomination. It is organized exclusively for religious purposes, which purposes include, but are not limited to, the following, as defined by the GM Church’s *TBD&D*:

- A. The mission of the GM Church is to make disciples of Jesus Christ who worship passionately, love extravagantly, and witness boldly.
- B. As a Wesleyan expression of Christianity, the GM Church professes the Christian faith, established on the confession of Jesus as Messiah, the Son of God, and Resurrected Lord of heaven and earth.
- C. Remain rooted and grounded in the Scriptures and in the historic teachings of the Christian church as defined in our *Articles of Religion* and *Confession of Faith*, and understood through the Wesleyan lens of faith.
- D. Aspire to introduce all people, without exception, to Jesus Christ, recognizing that the mission in which we are engaged has eternal consequences. We are committed to carry out the Great Commission of Jesus in Matthew 28 to go into all the world to make disciples of Christ, teaching and baptizing in His name.
- E. Lead all those who experience new birth in Jesus to deepen and grow in their relationship with Him, inviting the Holy Spirit to produce spiritual fruit within their lives as they similarly manifest the gifts of that Spirit. We encourage all to participate in

discipleship and accountability groups, such as Wesleyan class and band meetings, and to utilize all the other means of grace to achieve this end.

**F.** Model the love of God in order to respond to the summons to love the Lord our God with all of our heart, mind, soul, and strength, and to love our neighbors as ourselves. To this end, we are committed to fulfill the commandment in John 21 of lovingly feeding and tending to the flock of God and others, worshiping God in spirit and in truth, and watching over one another in love. This the church does until, perfected in love, it experiences the fullness of God's restored Kingdom with Christ.

**G.** Recognize the laity as the people of God and a royal priesthood, chosen and empowered for the work of God in this world in full partnership with our clergy. We affirm the participation and leadership of those of all races, ethnicities, nationalities, sexes, and ages in the Body of Christ.

**H.** Encourage and affirm the call of God in the lives of clergy who are grounded in the authoritative witness of the Scriptures, set apart by the church, and recognized to possess the necessary gifts and graces for ministry in alignment and accountability with our settled doctrines and discipline.

**I.** Display a "catholic spirit" to the church universal, cherishing our place within the greater Body of Christ through mutual respect, cooperative relationships, and shared mission with others wherever possible. We envision a global church in which all work together, resourcing and learning from one another, to fulfill the tasks of the church given to it by God.

**J.** Provide an organization and structure that is able to accomplish its primary functions of support, with a connectional polity that can empower and multiply the gifts of all for the sake of Christ's work in the world.

**K.** Additional general purposes and powers are:

1. To solicit, collect, receive, acquire, hold and invest money and property, both real and personal, including money and property received by gift, contribution, bequest or devise; to sell and convert property, both real and personal, into cash, and to use the funds of the annual conference and the proceeds, income, rents, issues, and projects derived from any property of the annual conference for any of the purposes for which the annual conference is formed;
2. To purchase, acquire, own, hold, sell, assign, transfer, dispose of, mortgage, pledge, hypothecate, or encumber shares, bonds, notes, debentures, or other securities or evidences of indebtedness of any person, firm, corporation, or association and, while the owner or holder of them, to exercise all rights, powers and privileges of ownership;

3. To purchase or acquire, own, hold, use, lease (either as lessor or lessee), sell, exchange, assign, convey, dispose of, mortgage, hypothecate, or encumber real and personal property;
4. To enter into, make, perform and carry out contracts of every kind for any lawful purpose without limit on amount, with any person, firm, association or corporation, municipality, county, parish, state, territory, government, or other municipal or governmental subdivision;
5. To borrow money, incur indebtedness, and to secure repayment by mortgage, pledge, deed of trust, or other hypothecation of property, both real and personal; and
6. To do all things necessary, expedient, or appropriate to the accomplishment of any of the objects and purposes for which this corporation is formed.

**L.** Notwithstanding any of the above statements of purposes and powers, this corporation shall not, except to an insubstantial degree, engage in any activities or exercise any powers that are not in furtherance of the primary purposes of the GM Church or the annual conference. No part of the net earnings of the GM Church or the annual conference shall ever inure to or for the benefit of or be distributable to its members, board or committee members, officers, or other private persons, except that the annual conference shall be empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes for which it was formed (e.g., benevolence gifts to those in need).

**M.** Notwithstanding any other provisions of these Bylaws, the annual conference shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on (a) by an association exempt from Federal Income Tax under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 (or any corresponding or successor provision of any United States Internal Revenue Law), or (b) by a corporation, contributions to which are deductible under Section 170(c)(2) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 (or any corresponding or successor provision of any United States Internal Revenue Law).

**Section 4. Statement Faith and Doctrinal Standards.** The annual conference shall maintain its beliefs and practices in accord with the GM Church Doctrinal Standards and Social Witness stated in the GM Church *TBD&D* and any subsequent GM Church *BD&D*.

## **Article II Membership**

**Section 1.** The voting membership of an annual conference shall be composed of active deacons, elders, and senior clergy who meet the qualifications of the *TBD&D* or *BD&D*, as well as at least an equal number of lay members elected by each charge or by the district or annual conference. Each charge shall be entitled to as many lay members as it has appointed clergy.

**Section 2.** The annual conference may add as lay members of the annual conference those who are serving in conference leadership positions.

**Section 3.** The annual conference shall determine the method of electing additional lay members to equalize the number of clergy members. Only laity shall vote in the election of equaling laity. Such members may be elected by a charge conference, district conference, or the annual conference, but they must be elected and not appointed.

**Section 4.** If not otherwise a voting member of the annual conference, the conference chancellor shall be seated in the annual conference and shall be given the privilege of the floor without vote.

### **Article III Meetings**

**Section 1.** The bishop shall appoint the time and place for holding the annual session of the annual conference, in coordination with whatever committee or group is tasked with planning and organizing the conference.

**Section 2.** Where necessary due to local conditions that prevent the physical assembling of delegates, the bishop may, with a two-thirds vote of the cabinet, authorize the conducting of the conference via electronic or other digital means.

**Section 3.** A special session of the annual conference may be held at such time and in such place as shall have been determined by the annual conference after consultation with the bishop, or by the bishop with the concurrence of three-fourths of the presiding elders (district superintendents). A special session of the annual conference shall have only such powers as are stated in the call, unless the annual conference by a two-thirds vote shall determine that other business may be transacted.

**Section 4.** *Quorum*—When the annual conference is in session, it shall require the presence of a majority of the whole number of members of the annual conference to constitute a quorum for the transaction of business; but a smaller number may take a recess or adjourn from time to time in order to secure a quorum, and at the final session may approve the journal, order the record of the roll call, and adjourn *sine die*.

**Section 5.** The bishop assigned shall preside over any sessions of the annual conference or, in case of inability, shall arrange for another bishop to preside. In the absence of a bishop or appointed president *pro tempore* (see Article VI, Section 1), the conference shall by ballot, without debate, elect a president *pro tempore* from among the ordained elders. The president thus elected shall discharge all the duties of a bishop except ordination during the annual conference session in which they are elected.

**Section 6.** The annual conference shall elect a secretary (see Article VI, Section 4) and such other officers as it may determine.

**Section 7.** When at any time a lay member is unable to attend the session, the alternate lay member, if present, shall be seated. The lay member or the alternate, whichever is seated, has the responsibility of the lay member to report to the local church on actions of the annual conference.

#### **Article IV**

### **Annual Conference Powers and Duties**

**Section 1. General Powers.** The annual conference shall connect clergy and laity for shared ministry and accountability across a geographical region. It shall gather for edification, fellowship, and inspiration, as well as to plan and implement its purposes.

**Section 2. Specific Powers and Duties.** The annual conference is charged with the following responsibilities:

- A.** Create a program of ministry within its area that can fulfill the mission of the church and enhance its witness.
- B.** Determine a program for raising and distributing funds necessary to conduct the work and mission of the church in its region.
- C.** Encourage and facilitate the planting of new churches, including the authorization of sponsorship by existing congregations, and to charter such new congregations.
- D.** Establish the number of districts within its area, upon recommendation from the bishop, cabinet, and conference leadership.
- E.** Form such boards, committees and agencies as may be required to further its mission, specifying the composition of each body and electing the members thereof.
- F.** Elect clergy and lay delegates to the General Conference of the GM Church according to the formula determined by the Transitional Leadership Council or the General Conference of the GM Church. Clergy delegates to the General Conference shall be members in full connection in good standing of the GM Church, or its predecessors, who have served a minimum of two years preceding their election. Lay delegates to the General Conference shall have been professing members of the GM Church, or its predecessors, for at least two years. Both clergy and lay delegates shall be elected by a minimum of fifty percent of votes cast plus one, with clergy voting for clergy delegates and laity voting for lay delegates.
- G.** Following the adoption of a constitution for the GM Church, vote on all constitutional amendments as approved by the General Conference and distributed to the annual conferences for ratification.

**H.** The ordained clergy meeting in executive session are to approve the ordination of clergy as recommended by the annual conference board of ministry, and to approve clergy status changes as recommended by the board of ministry.

**I.** Establish minimum standards for parsonages and other ministry housing, as well as minimum compensation standards for clergy, if desired.

**J.** Approve by simple majority vote the transfer of a congregation into or out of the annual conference to or from another annual conference, and to approve by simple majority vote the departure of a local church from the GM Church.

**K.** Maintain the records of the annual conference, including the records of closed churches and annual statistical reports from all local churches.

**L.** Adopt rules for its own governance, provided they do not conflict with the requirements of the *TBD&D* or the *BD&D*.

## **Article V**

### **Councils, Boards, and Committees**

The annual conference shall create the following councils, boards, and committees. Each council, board, or committee shall adopt its own rules of governance, consistent with the *TBD&D* or the *BD&D*.

**Section 1. Connectional Council.** The Connectional Council shall meet at least three times per year face-to-face (absent exigent circumstances that would require electronic or other forms of meeting) for the purpose of communication and coordination of ministry among the boards and committees.

- A.** Membership of the Connectional Council shall consist of the following:
- 1.** One clergy and one lay person elected by and from each annual conference board or committee, including the board or committee chair;
  - 2.** The bishop or president *pro tempore*;
  - 3.** One presiding elder (district superintendent) as a representative of the cabinet;
  - 4.** The annual conference secretary;
  - 5.** The annual conference lay leader, if any;
  - 6.** Any other conference officers elected by the annual conference, if any;

7. Any members at large elected by the annual conference to promote diversity or to obtain specific gifts, skills, or expertise, if any, upon nomination by the Leadership Committee;
8. The conference operating officer (COO) and other appropriate conference staff persons as the COO determines shall serve as members of the council with voice but without vote.

**B.** The Council shall have the following specific authority and responsibilities:

1. To engage in proactive strategizing, including a strategic plan, for growth in discipleship and mission, and to implement the priorities established by annual conference, making recommendations to the boards and committees for implementation.
2. To adjust the annual conference budget between sessions with published rationale, as long as it does not exceed the total amount of the budget.
3. To hire, with the consent of the bishop or president pro tempore, the conference operating officer and evaluate his/her work annually.
4. To approve the staffing levels for all boards and committees, consistent with budget limitations, such staff to be hired by and responsible to the conference operating officer.
5. To adopt policies and procedures, subject to annual conference approval, applicable to the annual conference, its boards and committees, and its other entities in alignment with the *TBD&D* and the *BD&D* and the priorities set by annual conference.
6. To coordinate proposals coming from the boards and committees to the annual conference, including the proposed budget, to assure congruence with the church's mission and strategy, as well as congruence with each other.
7. To initiate, staff, and set parameters for task forces dealing with issues beyond the scope of an individual board or committee.
8. Any other responsibilities or authorities assigned by the annual conference not in conflict with the *TBD&D* or the *BD&D*.

**Section 2. *The Board of Ministry.*** The Board of Ministry shall be responsible for overseeing the recruiting and credentialing of clergy for the furtherance of the mission of the GM Church. The Board shall also be responsible for overseeing all clergy changes in conference relations. The composition of the board and its powers and responsibilities shall be those set by the *TBD&D* and the *BD&D*.

**Section 3. *Episcopacy Committee.*** The Episcopacy Committee shall be responsible to support the bishop in the oversight of the spiritual and temporal affairs of the G M Church, with special reference to the area where the bishop has residential responsibility. The composition of the committee and its powers and responsibilities shall be those set by the *TBD&D* and the *BD&D*

**Section 4. *Finance, Administration, Pensions, and Benefits Committee.*** The Finance, Administration, Pensions, and Benefits Committee shall be responsible to develop, maintain, and administer a comprehensive and coordinated plan of fiscal and administrative policies, budgets, procedures, pension and benefits plans (to the extent the annual conference is authorized to develop, maintain, and administer such plans by the General Conference), and management services for the annual conference. The composition of the committee and its powers and responsibilities shall be those set by the *TBD&D* and the *BD&D*.

**Section 5. *Leadership Committee.*** The Leadership Committee shall be responsible for nominating clergy and laity to serve on annual conference committees and boards, as provided in the *TBD&D* or *BD&D*. The composition of the committee and its powers and responsibilities shall be those set by the *TBD&D* and the *BD&D*.

**Section 6. *Committee on Investigation.*** The Committee on Investigation shall be responsible for considering judicial complaints against clergy as set out in Part Eight Judicial Administration of the *TBD&D* or the *BD&D*. The composition of the committee and its powers and responsibilities shall be those set by the *TBD&D* and the *BD&D*.

**Section 7. *Administrative Review Committee.*** The Administrative Review Committee shall be responsible for ensuring that the disciplinary procedures for resolving a substantiated administrative complaint are properly followed as required by *Judicial Practices and Procedures* and fair process. The composition of the committee and its powers and responsibilities shall be those set by the *TBD&D* and the *BD&D*.

**Section 8. *Board of Trustees.*** The Board of Trustees shall be responsible for the administration of the real and personal property received and held by the annual conference. The Board of Trustees shall present a report to the annual conference of its actions taken, including a statement of all funds, properties, receipts and disbursements made during the year preceding the session. The term "trustee, trustees, Board of Trustees," as used herein, shall be construed to be synonymous with "director, directors and Board of Directors" as applied to corporations. The Board shall meet annually, as required by Kentucky law. For purposes of the corporation formed under Kentucky law, the bishop, or president *pro tempore* if no Bishop has been appointed, shall be the President of the corporation. The Secretary and Treasurer of the annual conference shall serve in those positions in said corporation. The Board of Trustees may elect a vice-president, whose duties shall be those usually pertaining to such office.

**Section 9.** The annual conference may create additional boards and committees to accomplish its work, as it deems appropriate.



## Article VI

### Organization

**Section 1. Bishop.** The annual conference, its churches, and its clergy shall receive supervision from a bishop who is chosen and assigned in the manner set by the GM Church's *TBD&D* or its successor *BD&D* adopted by future GM Church General Conferences. The bishop shall have such powers and responsibilities as set by the *TBD&D* and the *BD&D*. Prior to the convening General Conference, in areas where no bishop or president *pro tempore* has yet been assigned residential responsibility, the Transitional Leadership Council shall be responsible for appointing pastors to local churches that lack them. The Transitional Leadership Council may appoint a president *pro tempore*, who is an elder given responsibility for supervisory oversight of a geographical area until a bishop is assigned to oversee that area. The president *pro tempore* shall have such powers and responsibilities as a bishop under the *TBD&D* and *BD&D* with the exception that they shall not have authority to ordain.

**Section 2. Presiding Elder.** As an extension of the office of bishop, the presiding elder (district superintendent) shall oversee the total ministry of the clergy and churches in the communities of the district in their missions of witness and service in the world. The presiding elder shall have such powers and responsibilities as set by the *TBD&D* and the *BD&D*. The presiding elder is appointed by and serves at the pleasure of the bishop, assuming such leadership responsibilities as the bishop determines for the health and effectiveness of the local churches in the district and annual conference.

**Section 3. The Cabinet.** Presiding elders (district superintendents), although assigned to districts, also have conference-wide responsibilities. Presiding elders become through their selection members first of a cabinet before they are subsequently assigned by the bishop to service in districts. The cabinet shall have such powers and responsibilities as set by the *TBD&D* and the *BD&D*. The cabinet under the leadership of the bishop is the expression of superintending leadership in and through the annual conference. In consultation with the Connectional Council, it is expected to speak pastorally to the conference and for the conference to the spiritual and temporal issues that exist within the region encompassed by the conference. When the cabinet considers matters relating to coordination, implementation, or administration of the conference program, and other matters as the cabinet may determine, the conference lay leader and other conference staff as appropriate shall be invited to be present.

**Section 4. Secretary.** The annual conference shall elect a secretary who is responsible for maintaining the records and proceedings of the annual conference, making reports as needed, and fulfilling the responsibilities assigned by the annual conference. The secretary may be assisted by paid staff persons at the discretion of the annual conference. The secretary shall be considered an officer of the conference.

**Section 5. Lay Leader.** The annual conference may elect a lay leader from among the lay members of the annual conference to promote and make visible the ministry of the laity as equal

partners with clergy and fulfill the responsibilities assigned by the annual conference. If so elected, the lay leader shall be considered an officer of the conference.

**Section 6. Other officers.** The annual conference at its discretion may elect other officers to serve in such capacity and fulfill such responsibilities as assigned by the annual conference.

## **Article VII Districts**

The annual conference shall establish the number and boundaries of districts, upon recommendation from the bishop, cabinet, and conference leadership. The districts, their churches, and their clergy shall receive supervision and leadership from the presiding elder assigned by the bishop or president *pro tempore*.

## **Article VIII Books and Records**

**Section 1. Records.** The annual conference shall keep correct and complete books and records of account and shall also keep minutes of all annual conference, board, and committee meetings. The annual conference shall gather such district and congregational statistics as necessary to fulfill its purposes or are required by the *TBD&D* or *BD&D*.

**Section 2. Right to Review Books and Records.** Any member shall have the right to examine the books and records of the annual conference, except for confidential personnel records, and may do so only at a reasonable and convenient time as established by the annual conference. In any event, no member shall have the right to examine any personnel, financial, or medical information that would violate the personal privacy rights of staff, members, contributors, or guests as determined by the annual conference Finance, Administration, Pensions, and Benefits Committee.

## **Article IX Limitations of Liability and Indemnification**

In the event a director, board or committee member, officer, employee, member, or agent of the annual conference, who is serving at the request of the annual conference, is made a party to a suit or proceeding, whether civil, criminal, administrative, or investigative, other than an action by or in the right of the annual conference, by reason of the fact that he or she is or was a board or committee member, officer, employee, member, or agent of the annual conference, the annual conference will indemnify or reimburse him or her against expenses, including reasonable attorneys' fees, judgments, fines, and amounts paid in settlement actually and reasonably incurred by him or her in connection with such action, suit, or proceeding if he or she acted in good faith and in a manner he or she reasonably believed to be in or not opposed to the best interests of the annual conference, and with respect to any criminal proceedings, if he or she had no reasonable cause to believe that any conduct was unlawful.

**Article X**  
**Amendment of Articles of Incorporation and Bylaws**

The Article of Incorporation and Bylaws may be amended, repealed, or new Articles of Incorporation or Bylaws may be adopted by the affirmative vote of seventy-five percent (75%) of the annual conference members at a meeting held for such purpose if a quorum is present.

**Article XI**  
**Accounting Provisions**

The annual accounting period for this corporation shall begin on the first day of January and shall end on the last day of December. All accounting procedures shall follow generally accepted accounting principles and be consistent with the requirements established by the GM Church Connectional Commission on Finance, Administration, Pensions, and Benefits.

**Article XII**  
**Dissolution**

The dissolution of the annual conference and the corporation shall be governed by the actions of the GM Church in accordance with the provisions of the *TBD&D* and *BD&D*.

In the event of a dissolution of the corporation, the Directors of the Corporation shall, after making provisions for the payment of the liabilities of the corporation, dispose of all of the assets of the corporation in a manner consistent with the provisions of the Kentucky Revised Statutes and the *TBD&D* and *BD&D*. Any assets not disposed of in accordance with the above direction shall be disposed of by a court of competent jurisdiction in which the principal office of the corporation is then located for all such purposes as shall at the time qualify as an exempt organization under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended.

**Article XIII**  
**Miscellaneous**

**Section 1. Inspection of Certificate of Formation and Bylaws.** The annual conference shall keep in its principal office the original or a copy of its Articles of Incorporation and Bylaws, as amended to date, which shall be open to inspection by the members at all reasonable times during normal office hours. Digital copies of these documents shall be made available upon request.

**Section 2. Construction of Definitions; Choice of Law; Mediation & Binding Arbitration and Venue.**

Unless the context otherwise requires, the general provisions, rules of construction, and definitions contained in KRS 273.161, et. seq., and any other applicable Kentucky law, shall govern the construction of these by-laws and any legal dispute which arises regarding the construction and/or implementation of these by-laws.

Any claim or dispute arising from or relating to these by-laws or other any intra-annual conference (corporate) dispute (including, but not limited to, the construction

and/or implementation of these by-laws) involving the annual conference, any of its directors, officers or board or committee members, and/or its congregational, clergy, or lay members shall be settled by recourse to the processes provided in the *TBD&D* and the *BD&D*. Venue for the mediation or arbitration of such claims or disputes shall be in Fayette County, Kentucky.

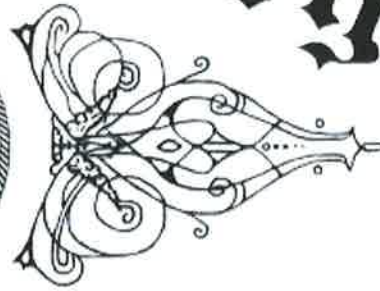
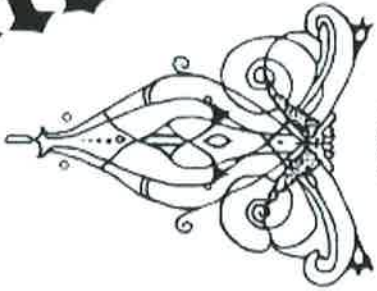
