(1) How do you understand the purpose of the GMC and its role in the world? (Please, do not copy from the GMC mission statement.)

Members of the Global Methodist Church, like all believers, are charged with making disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything that Jesus has commanded (Matt. 28:19-20). Just as the early church handed on the apostles' teaching, prayed and fellowshipped together, and celebrated the Last Supper together (Acts 2:42), we are called to do the same. Together we contend for the faith once delivered (Jude 1:3). Part of what makes the GMC unique, however, is our Wesleyan theological outlook, in which we emphasize God's prevenient grace, justification by faith, and sanctification by the Holy Spirit. We embrace the call to holiness and Christian perfection, believing that the Holy Spirit is transforming us so that we can fully love God and neighbor.

(2) Describe some personal experiences that will bring value to your work as a General Conference delegate.

I have served on the Global Council for the Wesleyan Covenant Association since 2019; I also serve on the Transitional Commission on Discipleship, Doctrine, and Just Ministry for the GMC, as well as the Committee on Educational Programs for the GMC. As a result, I have been a part of various conversations in the last several years regarding the needs of the new denomination and the challenges facing it.

In addition, I serve as Assistant Lead Editor for Firebrand magazine and have taught as part of the School of Methodism for the John Wesley Institute (JWI). I have participated in the JWI summits that produced the statement, The Faith Once Delivered, and the forthcoming statement on Wesleyan Holiness. My appointment as Elder is to teach at Asbury University, where I have served for the past four years. (I also taught at Malone University for 16 years.) I teach various New Testament, preaching, and theology courses. These have all deepened my thinking on questions of Methodist theology and polity.

I was a Deacon in the UMC for more than two decades prior to transferring to the GMC and being ordained an Elder. In the UMC I served on the Board of Ministry in East Ohio for six years. I have a Ph.D. in New Testament Studies from the University of Durham (England), an M.Div. from Asbury Theological Seminary, and a B.A. in Journalism from the University of Minnesota.

These combined experiences have allowed me to see the beauty of the Church when it faithfully imitates Christ through love and service; but I have also witnessed the ugliness that occurs when those who are part of the church turn away from the historic faith. My aim as a GMC delegate is to build a church that will boldly declare its allegiance to Christ, even when the world opposes our attempts to do so.

(3) In your opinion, what is the most important thing the General Conference needs to accomplish to be considered successful?

We need to establish the Doctrine and Discipline of the Global Methodist Church in such a way that it reflects: 1) A Church focused on giving glory to God and making disciples of all nations; 2) A commitment to upholding our Wesleyan theological understanding of the faith once delivered; 3) A streamlined administration that equips ministry, rather than setting up bureaucratic barriers to ministry; and 4) a global community that supports Methodist churches around the world.

(4) In your own words, what have you experienced that shows your passion for "Let the redeemed of the Lord... Tell the story" Psalm 107:2

This psalm is all about those whose distress and desperation causes them to call out to the Lord—and they experience God's redemption. It's such a beautiful picture of the Gospel: after all, we don't turn to the Lord for salvation unless we first recognize our own sinfulness and desperate need for new life. We recognize that we can't fix what is wrong on our own—only Jesus can atone for our sins, reconcile our relationship with God, and bring about our transformation. Yet this dependence on the Lord is not a one-off event. Every day we must live in God's grace. In my own life, I have experienced deep losses that led to cynicism and questioning of the Lord. Each step of the way I have found Jesus to be patient, full of grace, and incredibly loving. The Lord is faithful, even when I am not. As the psalm says (v. 1), "Give thanks to the Lord, for he is good; his love endures forever." Those of us who have experienced this goodness are compelled to share with other desperate people the truths of a God who is ever-present and ever-loving. This is the calling of the Global Methodist Church.
